Dear Homeowner,

You have been referred to us as a potential participant in Community Action Partnership of Oregon's (CAPO) Income Based Energy Efficiency Pilot. You will find an application for this program enclosed.

This program is funded through a partnership between Portland General Electric ratepayers and a federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act appliance replacement program.

Under this program you may be eligible to receive a heat pump installed to replace your existing electric heating system or a replacement appliance such as a refrigerator. If approved there will be no cost to you for the energy efficiency upgrades. Please note, however, that if your home needs repairs in order to be eligible for the program you may need to cover the cost of repairs if you choose.

This is a pilot program. Applications will be reviewed on a first come first served basis and funding is limited.

In order to participate in this program you must:

- Own your home
- Income qualify
- Have Portland General Electric (PGE) supplied electricity as your primary heat source

Please also include a copy of your PGE bill and a copy of valid photo ID or social security card for the homeowner/head of household.

If we receive your application and find that you qualify for the program, an auditor will be sent to your home to inspect the property and make sure it allows for upgrades to be installed effectively. From there we will work with you to install the eligible upgrades. The contractor will have documents for you to fill out to ensure CAPO receives appropriate funding and rebates, but again there will be no cost for the energy efficiency upgrades.

**If you are experiencing an emergency and are going to have your heat shut off please contact your local Community Action Agency. This is not an emergency heating program.**

Because this is a short term pilot program with limited funding, please submit the application and supporting documents as soon as possible to help ensure you can participate in the program.
