CEP provides in-home services for income-qualified seniors and people with disabilities.

Weatherization

Community Weatherization Teams are trained by CEP staff and volunteer their time to help install energy-saving materials in our clients' homes in Multnomah County.

Home Safety Repairs

Staff and trained volunteers provide small safety repair services such as: installing grab bars, bathtub transfer benches, installing carbon, monoxide and smoke detectors, and making minor carpentry repairs to small areas of stairs and porches. Available in the City of Portland only.
