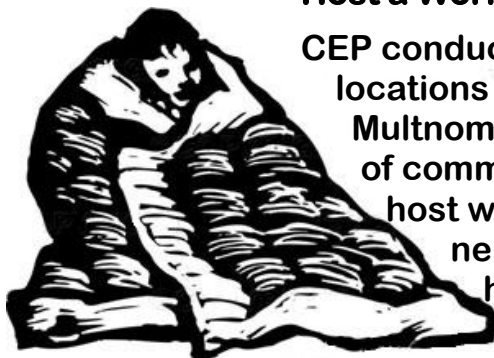
## The Weatherization Kit

- ❖ Rope caulk, outlet/switch gaskets, compact florescent light, thermometer, and more.
