



## **DeNice's Story**

DeNice received notice from her homeowner's insurance that she had violations on her property that could lead to policy cancellation. She couldn't afford to have the items addressed so her insurance company dropped her policy.

"If I don't have insurance I could lose my home! My mortgage requires me to have homeowner's insurance."

Painting of some fascia boards, a fallen fence repaired and a tree trimmed, these all seem like small repairs, but to DeNice, a 69 year old senior, getting on a ladder with a paint brush or trimming shears seemed all but impossible.



Through Community Energy Project's In-Home Repairs program, the repairs were made and DeNice was able to get her insurance policy reinstated. DeNice has renewed peace of mind that she will not lose her home, thanks to CEP and its services.
